This Drama Vocabulary Worksheet Pack is for students to complete at home or in the classroom. It consists of several activities that explore the language and terminology used in a drama context, asking students to describe, define and explain different terms. The activities are intended to support students in using appropriate terminology as part of performing, learning and evaluating conversations in the drama setting.

This is a generic pack that can be used with any students at any stage in their drama learning: as an introductory lesson for students who are new to drama; as a revision tool; to supplement practical lessons.

The second half of this pack consists of the **Answers** section. This is, effectively, a separate pack for teachers and anyone who will be marking the students' work. I have given examples of all the answers, but of course these will not be the only options in most cases and teachers should use their discretion when marking. Students should be encouraged to research, remember and use their drama notebooks to answer the questions in this pack. Spaces have been included for students to write the answers, or a separate sheet or notebook could be used. There are also spaces after each activity for Additional Notes – these can be from the teacher or student.
